



# Daikundy Province

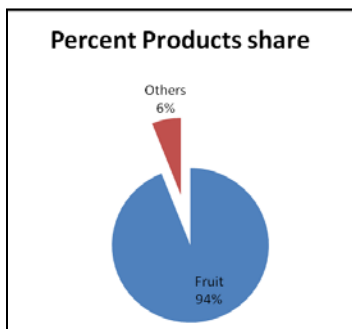
## About Daikundy

Daikundy is located in the central highland region of Afghanistan. Almost the whole province is mountainous or semi mountainous (96.6%). About 99% of the population lives in rural areas and Daikundy has an estimated population of 477,544 people (2008 census).



## Daikundy Districts: Agricultural Characteristics

Daikundy has 9 districts: Nili, Shahrstan, Miramor, Ashtarlai, Sang-i-Takht, Khedir, Kejran, Geti, and Gizab.



Fruit and nuts (94%) are the most dominant agricultural products in this province. Almond orchards can be found in most districts. Most farmers have livestock. The province's topography (hilly and mountainous) makes it a good environment for raising animals (sheep, goat, and cows are the dominant household livestock).

## Possible opportunities for Agriculture improvement

Daikundy is famous for producing rugs, carpets, almonds and different kinds of dried fruit, such as apricot and raisin. Herders raise sheep and goats in several districts. Horticultural programs, such as, nurseries for producing healthy trees, pasture improvement, infrastructure improvement, value adding (product processing), pasture improvement, postharvest technology and irrigation system improvement are some potential areas for development.
